


CALL TO WORSHIP • Psalm 118:1-4

CALL TO CONFESSION OF SIN • 1 Peter 1:18-19

You were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.

CONFESSION OF SIN

We confess, our Father, that we do not live up to the family name. We are more ready to resent than to forgive, more ready to manipulate than to serve, more ready to fear than to love, more ready to keep our distance than to welcome, more ready to compete than to help. 

For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.



OLD TESTAMENT READING • Ecclesiastes 1:12-18*

¹² I the Preacher have been king over Israel in Jerusalem. ¹³ And I applied my heart to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven. It is an evil business that God has given to the children of man to be troubled with. ¹⁴ I have seen everything that is done under the sun, and behold, all is vapor and herding wind.



Therefore let us keep the feast.




