You Are Before Me, Lord

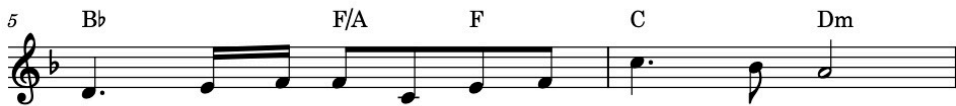

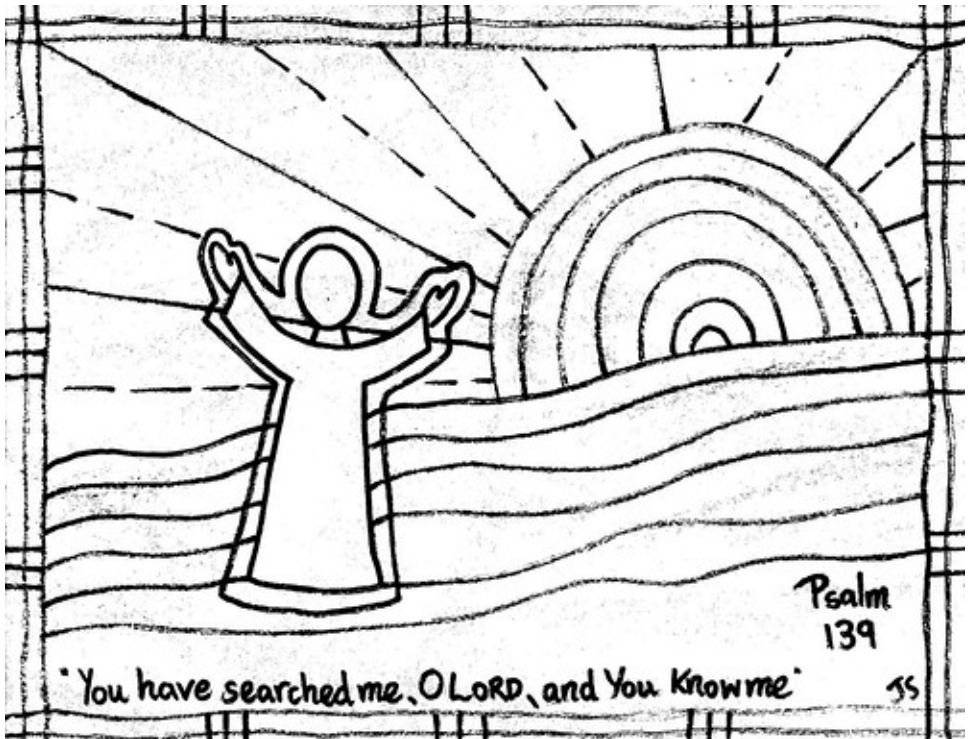
